## Meet Wanda Jackson

Wanda's parents bought this lovely double 'shotgun' house in the 9th ward in 1972. When Hurricane Katrina hit, it received about 6 ft of flood water. Wanda survived her parents and moved into the home, which is almost completed. Her son Atwood Jackson and his family will occupy one side while Wanda and her daughter Brandi will live in the other side. After insurance and supplemental funds were depleted, she only needs one very essential item, the completion of the work on her central air conditioning unit.

## Funds are needed to rebuild this home.
